"If given the chance to speak to my teenage self, I'd say to her now: it gets better for you-and once it does, you'll see that it doesn't end with vou. Celebrate the victories we've made-but don't let them lull vou into complacency." Eleni Stephanides



"Not when many young queersboth in rural towns and more urban areas-remain in the closet, compartmentalizing who they are out of fear of familial rejection. Not when in some countries, people can still be killed for living openly as gay.

"And not when the rights of some members of our community (such as queer people of color and transgender people) remain under threat. A Black man who can marry his partner but still has to worry about violence at the hands of police isn't experiencing equality in the full sense of the word." Eleni Stephanides



"Keep living with eyes, heart, ears, and hands open to the issues affecting members of both our queer community and the larger human family-because if there's one thing being LGBT has taught me, it's the importance of not leaving people to suffer in silence. 

A Survival Guide for the Worried

Asli Aydintasbas is a journalist who lived in Turkey during the rise of authoritarianism there. She said, "I know how self-censorship starts in small ways but then creeps into operations on a daily basis. I am familiar with the rhythms of the battle to reshape the media, state institutions and the judiciary." Asli believes there are strategies that can be helpful for LGBTQ and their allies to weather these next years and "come out stronger." She shares these strategies here. Among others, these strategies include "Have Hope,""Don't Panic," and "Don't Disengage."
